Postdoctoral Fellowship for Academic Year 2017-2018**

The College of Arts & Letters and the [Office of Digital Learning](#) at Notre Dame are pleased to announce a postdoctoral fellowship for 2016-2017. The postdoctoral fellow will be exposed to a wide variety of practice areas within the field of digital learning at the university level, including the following: (instructional/learning design; online course operations and production; digital pedagogies; instructional media production; research in the sciences of learning; curriculum and policy). S/he will have the opportunity to develop expertise within one of these practice areas, will be mentored by professional staff, and will work directly and deeply with faculty project leads as a key part of the creative team. Depending on the project(s), the postdoctoral fellow may also participate in research and teaching opportunities.

Qualifications

- Eligibility for the Arts & Letters Postdoctoral Fellowship 5+1 program;
- Excellent interpersonal skills and demonstrated ability to function successfully within a team context;
- Creativity, pedagogical insight, energy;
- Demonstrated success in the classroom and a 'teacherly' mindset is essential;
- Acquaintance with basic technologies and platforms along with a desire to investigate digital learning is crucial; technical skill or prior experience with technology enabled teaching/learning is not required.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Work as part of an ODL design and production team supporting one or more faculty digital learning projects, depending upon scope but on average 20 hours per week.
- Work as a proxy for and partner with faculty to assist in creating pedagogically effective learning materials;
- Regular reporting on progress within project management process;
- Research and writing related to the project(s), as appropriate;

Compensation

- ODL will provide an additional stipend of \$10,000 to supplement A&L funding.
- ODL will provide appropriate computer hardware and software as required to perform the duties required in this position.
